With the arrest of three persons, the Mumbai Crime Branch Zone-10 has busted an alleged Flesh Trade in Powai Plaza 1st Floor Shop No. 122/123 run by Vinita Mohite, Raid was carried out by Senior PI Deepak Sawant Under the Guidance Of IPS Lakhmi Gautam Sir Joint Commissioner of police), On the intervening evening of 28th February around 6:30. Cops said that 3 girls had been rescued from the racket. The illegal activities were being performed at a Spa & salon in Powai Plaza of Mumbai.



"Upon raiding the Salon, three girls and three men were found at the spot. Police have recovered several objectionable items along with other evidence from the spot. The case has been registered in Powai police station, FIR No. 0109 U/s IPC 370(3), 34 & 3,4,5 of The Immoral Trafficking Prevention Act against the three suspects," among other items have been recovered from their possession. Therapists are shown to the customer for choice at the reception counter.

Accuse Vinita @ Neelam Mohite is the mastermind behind this flesh trade, she also has another spa (Serenity) in Kapurbawadi, Thane west. Pimp Vinita Mohite is absconding, and Mumbai police are on the hunt to put Owner Vinita behind bars.



COOKING GAS CYLINDER PRICE HIKED BY ₹ 50, WILL NOW COST ₹ 1,103 IN DELHI

Commercial LPG cylinders will now cost ₹ 2,119.50 per unit in Delhi and the price of domestic LPG cylinders will be ₹ 1,103 per unit.

Petroleum and oil marketing companies raised the price of commercial liquid petroleum gas (LPG) cylinders by ₹ 350.50 per unit and domestic LPG cylinders by ₹ 50 per unit with immediate effect from Wednesday.

According to the revised rates. commercial LPG cylinders will now cost ₹ 2,119.50 per unit in Delhi and the price of domestic LPG cylinders will be ₹ 1,103 per unit, in the national capital. This is the second hike in commercial LPG cylinder prices this year.

THE ARVIND KEJRIWAL **GOVERNMENT MAY MAKE THE** APPOINTMENTS AFTER PRESIDENT DROUPADI MURMU APPROVES THE RESIGNATION OF MANISH SISODIA AND SATYENDAR JAIN

New Delhi: Saurabh Bhardwaj and Atishi, Delhi legislators prominent leaders of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), are likely to get minister posts after senior leaders Manish Sisodia and Satyendar Jain, both jailed in corruption cases, stepped down last evening, sources have said.

Chief Minister and AAP leader Arvind Kejriwal has sent necessary documents to Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena to proceed with the appointments, the sources added.

Mr Bhardwaj represents the south Delhi's Greater Kailash constituency and is also the chief spokesperson of the AAP. He is also vice-chairman of Delhi Jal Board, the agency responsible for supplying water to the national capital. He was a cabinet minister in the AAP government during the 49day tenure in 2013-14 after which Mr Kejriwal had stepped down, taking responsibility for the failure to bring the anti-corruption Jan Lokpal Bill.

Ms Atishi is MLA from Kalkaji is a member of the AAP's political affairs committee. She has served as an advisor to Mr Sisodia, primarily on education, between 2015 and 2017. A Rhodes scholar. she has risen as a prominent face of the party over the past few years. Delhi's Deputy Chief Minister

Sisodia, who held charge of as many as 18 departments, and Health Minister Jain stepped down last evening. The resignations came hours after Supreme Court refused relief to Mr Sisodia and asked him to challenge his arrest in the liquor policy case in Delhi High Court.

CHINA SAYS IT'S BEEN "OPEN AND TRANSPARENT" ON COVID ORIGINS



Beijing: China on Tuesday pushed back at renewed suggestions that the COVID-19 pandemic could have been the result of a lab leak, saying it has been "open and transparent" in the search for the virus' origins.

Recently, the US Department of Energy assessed with "low confidence" that the pandemic that was first detected in the central Chinese city of Wuhan in late 2019 began with the leak of a virus from a lab.

The report hasn't been made public and officials in Washington stressed that US agencies are not in agreement on the origin. China has "shared the most data and research results on virus tracing and made important contributions to global virus tracing research", Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning Mao told reporters on Tuesday at a daily briefing.

US officials and members of Congress have accused China of not been entirely cooperative with inquiries into the origin.

INDIA EXPERIENCED WARMEST FEBRUARY THIS YEAR SINCE 1877: IMD

India reported the warmest February this year since 1877 average maximum temperatures touching 29.54 degrees celsius, the weather office said on Tuesday while linking it with global warming. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said most parts of the country are expected to experience abovenormal temperatures while the southern peninsula and parts of Maharashtra are likely to escape the brunt of harsh weather conditions.

Addressing a virtual press conference, S C Bhan, the Head of the Hydromet and Agromet Advisory Services of IMD said there was little probability of heat waves in March, but most parts of the country could experience extreme weather conditions in April and May.

The monthly average maximum temperature for February was the highest since 1877, Bhan told reporters in response to a question, linking the rising trend to the phenomenon of global warming.

"The entire globe is living in an era of global warming. We are living in a warming world," Bhan said when asked whether the high temperatures were an indication of climate change.

The monthly average minimum temperature over the Indian region was the fifth highest during this February since 1901

Rainfall average over the country is most likely to be normal (83-117 per cent of long period average) in March, Bhan said. The LPA of rainfall over the country as a whole during March based on data from 1971-2020 is about 29.9 mm.

He said below-normal rainfall was expected over most areas of northwest India, west-central India and some parts of east and northeast India.

Bhan said currently, La Nina conditions were prevailing over the equatorial Pacific region, which was expected to weaken and turn to El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) neutral conditions during the premonsoon season.
