

IN FIR, WRESTLERS NARRATE TRAUMATIC EXPERIENCES OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT BY WFI CHIEF BRIJ BHUSHAN SINGH

MR. SINGH HAS BEEN BOOKED UNDER IPC SECTIONS 354 (ASSAULT OR CRIMINAL FORCE TO WOMAN WITH INTENT TO OUTRAGE HER MODESTY), 354A (SEXUAL HARASSMENT), 354D (STALKING) AND 34 (COMMON INTENTION). HE HAS ALSO BEEN BOOKED UNDER PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM SEXUAL OFFENCES (POCSO) ACT.

While Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief and BJP MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh remains defiant, the wrestlers, in the police FIR, have shared their ordeal of years of sexual harassment and how some were treated indifferently "for not supporting him".

The two FIRs were filed at Connaught Place police station by the Delhi Police, after the intervention of Supreme Court on April 28.

Mr. Singh has been booked under IPC 17 years old, her father filed the police complaint. Another wrestler, in the FIR, said Mr. Singh first sexually assaulted her in August last year. "When I was training, the accused called me separately.

WOMAN SAYS 'I HAVE A BOMB' AT MUMBAI AIRPORT, ARRESTED
A woman passenger was arrested on May 29 at the Mumbai airport after she claimed that she had a bomb in her bag, during an argument with airline executives over charges of carrying excess luggage.

According to personnel of Sahar police station, on May 29 evening, Ruchi Deepak Sharma, who was to board a Spicejet flight to Kolkata, handed over two bags to check in to airline staff Saurabh Labde. As per rules, domestic passengers are allowed to check in one bag not weighing more than 15 kilograms. However, the two bags Sharma was carrying weighed 22.05 kilograms. When she was told to pay the charges for excess luggage, she started arguing with the staffer, police said.

According to a police officer, she told the staffer, "this is how Marathi people harass non-marathis".

Eventually, senior airline officials and CISF guards were called in when Sharma said, "I have a bomb", an officer said.

Police control room was alerted and sniffer dogs called in to check her bags, states the FIR, adding no objectionable item was found.

Personnel from Sahar police station then took the woman to police station and placed her under arrest on a complaint filed by Dhanashri Wadkar, 23, a customer service executive of SpiceJet.

Sharma was arrested under sections 336 (Act endangering life or personal safety of others) and 505-2 (statements creating or promoting enmity, hatred, or ill will between classes) of the Indian Penal Code. She was released on bail by a local court later.

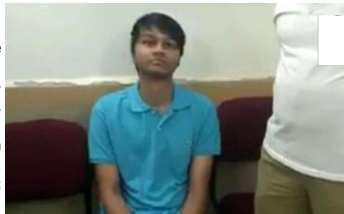

Previously, they had collaborated with drug lord Iqbal Mirchi, but after Mirchi's death in August 2013.



SPORTS MS Dhoni undergoes knee surgery in Mumbai

CSK captain is looking at a period of extensive rehab as he tries to see if he has one more IPL in him MS Dhoni underwent surgery on his left knee in a Mumbai hospital on Thursday.

Dhoni, who led Chennai Super Kings to their fifth IPL title, had flown to Mumbai from Ahmedabad after the final on Monday and consulted renowned sports orthopaedic surgeon Dr Dinshaw Pardiwala, who is also on the BCCI medical panel and has performed surgeries on a number of top Indian cricketers, including Rishabh Pant.

"Yes, Dhoni has had a successful knee surgery at the Kokilaben Hospital in Mumbai on Thursday," CSK CEO Kasi Viswanathan was quoted as saying by PTI. "He is doing fine and the surgery happened in the morning. I don't have details. I am yet to get all the details about the nature of surgery and other things."

According to PTI, Dhoni has already been discharged from the hospital after a keyhole surgery was performed for "arthroscopic repair".

MUMBAI: A 28-year-old woman was hospitalised with grievous injuries after being brutally assaulted by her boyfriend during an outing at Bandra Bandstand on Wednesday.

The woman told the police in her statement that her boyfriend, Akash Mukherjee, wanted to get intimate with her but she had refused. Police have arrested Mukherjee, also 28, on charges of attempted murder.

The woman and Mukherjee are co-workers and have been in a relationship for a little over a year. Mukherjee lives in Kalyan while she resides in Bhiwandi.

On Wednesday, the couple decided to go for an outing to Mumbai. They met at Kalyan station around 11.30am and took a local train to CSMT. The two went to the Gateway that was late and they should be heading of India where they spent some time.

Around 5pm, they returned to CSMT and railway station, they hailed an autorickshaw for Bandstand.

According to the woman's statement, she was chatting. Mukherjee allegedly told her



that he had converted to her faith so as to marry her. He suggested that they could show documents related to his conversion to her aunt and seek her blessings for the wedding.

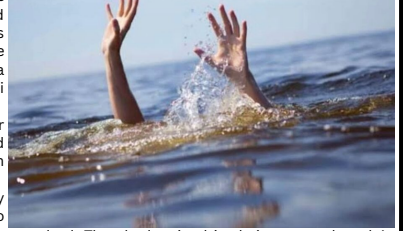

Tragically, Aarti and Preeti lost their lives in the incident that occurred during their summer vacation in Eklahare.

The incident took place on Thursday afternoon when the brave sisters, who had come from Bandra, Mumbai to spend their vacation, noticed a young girl struggling for her life in the river. Without hesitation, they plunged into the water to save her. In a heroic act, they managed to rescue their twelve-year-old cousin sister, Kaveri Babasaheb Arzende. However, their own lives were tragically lost in the process.

Aarti was a second-year college student in Bandra, while Preeti was in 12th



standard. They had arrived in their maternal uncle's village Eklahare ten days ago to celebrate their sister Shivani Rao Dhage's family event, the first birthday of Shivansh (1). The family had joyously celebrated Shivansh's birthday on Wednesday, but the happiness quickly turned into deep sorrow due to this heart-wrenching incident.

Accompanied by Kaveri Arzende, Varsha Narayan Ghorpade, and Kusha Narayan Ghorpade, Aarti and Preeti had ventured to the banks of the Ghod river. Tragically, they misjudged the depth of the water, resulting in their own drowning.

THREE WOMEN DEAD, FOUR INJURED AS RICKSHAW FALLS INTO DRAIN

Three women died and four persons were injured after the autorickshaw they were travelling in fell into a nullah (major drain) in Bhiwandi in Maharashtra's Thane district, a police official said on Thursday.

The incident took place under Kongaon police station limits on the Mumbai-Nashik highway in the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday, he added.

"The deceased and injured are kin of the autorickshaw driver and were returning from Mumbai. Passersby took part in the rescue efforts. The wife, sister-in-law and daughter of the driver have died," he said.

MUMBAI NEWS: FIR AGAINST NCP LEADER JITENDRA AWHAD FOR HIS REMARKS AGAINST SINDHI COMMUNITY



Mumbai: The Hill Line police station of Ulhasnagar on Thursday registered an FIR against Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader and former housing minister Jitendra Awhad over his allegedly objectionable remarks against the Sindhi community.

On May 27, the NCP's Ulhasnagar district president Panoram Kalani had organised a meeting of party workers. According to a video of the meeting which became viral, Awhad is seen making a highly objectionable remark about the Sindhi community. However, Awhad later clarified that he had not passed any remarks against the community. He said he referred to only one individual. There were also allegations from the NCP that the video was morphed. However, Sindhis of Ulhasnagar and other places protested against Awhad and demanded action against him.

Ulhasnagar unit president of the Bharatiya Janata Party Jamnadas Pursuwani said since Awhad had hurt the sentiments of the Sindhi community he registered an FIR against him.

R.S. Dhare, senior police inspector at Hill Line police station, said, "Based on the complaint from Pursuwani, we have registered a case against Awhad under IPC sections 153-A, 153-B, 295-A, and 298."

Earlier on Wednesday, the Sindhi community gathered aggressively in the Kopri area of Thane and protested against Awhad's reported statement. They said unless Awhad apologizes they will continue to protest through constitutional.

UNABLE TO REPAY DEBT, MUMBAI MAN FAKES KIDNAPPING TO GET MONEY FROM FATHER

Mumbai: A 27-year-old man from Mumbai was arrested for allegedly faking his own kidnapping and asking ransom from his family to repay his debt, the police said on Thursday.

Mumbai Deputy Commissioner of Police Ajay Bansal told reporters that the accused has been identified as Jitendra Joshi.

"A 27-year-old man, namely Jitendra Joshi faked his own kidnapping and asked for ransom from his family to repay his debt," the DCP said.

Joshi's wife had received a WhatsApp call, wherein she was told that her husband has been kidnapped and was threatened to pay a ransom of ₹ 5 lakhs. The accused's family informed the police after which it started the investigation.

Joshi was found within 12 hours and during interrogation it was revealed that he had faked his own kidnapping to get money from his father, the police said.

The DCP further said that the accused has been arrested and has been sent to police custody till June 3 by the court.

Further investigation is underway in the case.

SMOKE BREAK HELPS MUMBAI POLICE ARREST TWO BOGUS 'GOLD TRADERS' IN RAJASTHAN

On May 19, the fraudsters approached a gold dealer in Hyderabad, who was there for a jewellery exhibition. They pretended to be big shot gold traders and convinced the victim to place an order of Rs 50 lakhs with them.

Mumbai's LT Marg police caught hold of two fraudsters in Rajasthan, who cheated a gold dealer in Zaveri Bazar of Rs 42 lakh. Incidentally, it was one smoke break that the accused took that helped the police nab them.

On May 19, 25-year-old Hukumsingh Rajput and 20-year-old Chhattarsingh Rajput approached the gold dealer in Hyderabad, who was there for a jewellery exhibition. They pretended to be big-shot gold traders and convinced the victim to place an order of Rs 50 lakhs with them.

On May 22, Hukumsingh called the victim and said the order was ready. He asked him to pay an advance, for which the gold dealer initially refused. However, the fraudsters said they cannot deliver the jewellery unless an advance payment is made.

Following this, Chhattarsingh, the other accused, went to the victim's shop in Zaveri Bazar and collected Rs 42 lakh from him. The victim was promised that the jewellery will be delivered in an hour.

THREAT MESSAGES BY PRO-KHALISTAN GROUP: SIM BOXES SEIZED, 2 ACCUSED IDENTIFIED, SAY POLICE ON BHIWANDI RAID



Two persons were arrested in connection to releasing bulk calls and audio video messages ahead of the Test match, which was attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Australian counterpart, Anthony Albanese, on the first day.

In a raid at Bhiwandi in Maharashtra's Thane district, the Ahmedabad Cyber Crime Police on Thursday recovered four SIM boxes in connection to the ongoing investigation into threatening messages sent on behalf of a pro-Khalistan group, warning people against attending the India-Australia Test cricket match hosted at Narendra Modi stadium on March 8.

Jitendra Yadav, Assistant Commissioner of Police at Ahmedabad Cyber Crime Branch, said the police have identified two accused in the case, Bhiwandi residents Mashid Khan (43) and Mohammad Shahid Alam (42). Both are likely to be brought to Ahmedabad on Friday, he said, adding that raids are continuing in Bhiwandi.

ONE-THIRD TYPE 2 DIABETIC ADULTS MAY HAVE UNDETECTED CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE: STUDY

The study reveals that many people with Type 2 diabetes who have not had a heart attack or a history of cardiovascular disease are at high risk for cardiovascular complications.

One-third of Type 2 diabetic adults may have undiagnosed cardiovascular disease. In persons with Type 2 diabetes compared to those without Type 2 diabetes, elevated levels of two protein biomarkers that signify heart damage were linked to undiagnosed or symptomless cardiovascular disease. The findings of the study published in the Journal of the American Heart Association, an open access, peer-reviewed journal of the American Heart Association.

To detect heart damage and stress, tests for high-sensitivity cardiac troponin T and N-terminal pro-B-type natriuretic peptide are utilised. These exams are frequently used to identify heart failure and heart attacks.

The risk of future heart failure, coronary heart disease, or mortality may be increased by mildly higher concentrations of these proteins in the blood, which may be an early indicator of changes in the structure and function of the heart.
