



PROTESTING WRESTLERS MEET AMIT SHAH LATE ON SATURDAY NIGHT, ASK FOR EARLY CHARGESHEET: REPORT

RAKESH TIKAIT GAVE A DEADLINE OF JUNE 9 TO THE GOVERNMENT TO ARREST BRIJ BHUSHAN SHARAN SINGH

The wrestlers demanding action against Wrestling Federation of India chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, met Union home minister Amit Shah on Saturday night, reports said. The meeting at Amit Shah's residence went on till midnight where the protesters pressed for an early chargesheet against Brij Bhushan, who is also a BJP MP. After being evicted from Jantar Mantar where the country's top wrestlers have been protesting against the alleged sexual misconduct of Brij Bhushan, Sakshi Malik, Bajrang Punia, Vinesh Phogat joined their railway duties. Wrestlers confirmed meeting Amit Shah at his residence on Saturday night without revealing details of what happened. Union Home Minister Amit Shah listened to the wrestlers till late in

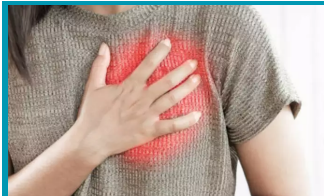


the first such high-level intervention into the ongoing issue. Earlier, the wrestlers spoke with sports minister Anurag Thakur who assured fair probe into their allegations. The late-night meeting with Amit Shah comes days after the wrestlers went to Haridwar to immerse their medals in the Ganga, but were stopped by farmers leader Rakesh Tikait who has given an ultimatum to the government to arrest Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh before June 9.

His ability to absorb pressure, play long innings, and contribute significantly to the team's success make him a vital member of the batting line-up.

"Coming back after 18-19 months, whatever has happened, good or bad, I don't want to think about my past. I just want to start afresh and keep doing whatever I have been doing," Rahane told BCCI TV on the sidelines of India's training session at Arundel in Portsmouth. "Personally enjoyed playing for CSK as I have been batting well throughout the season, even before IPL. I had a very good domestic season and I felt good. So this comeback was a bit emotional for me." Rahane, who was a part of CSK's fifth IPL title-winning side, has already received a lot of praise for his attacking batting and improved strike-rate in T20 cricket.

GANG SELLING FAKE AMUL BUTTER, GHEE BUSTED IN NOIDA

According to police, the accused used to allegedly package the butter and ghee in fake wrappers bearing the Amul brand name and sell it in the market. They said they have recovered such items worth Rs 65 lakh. A gang that was allegedly selling fake Amul butter and ghee, made using ingredients of different brands, was busted by Noida Police. They said they have recovered such items worth Rs 65 lakh. "We had received information that a group of people were supplying butter in huge amounts from a rented building in Phase 3. So we raided the place and found a lot of things, including around 5 quintals of fake ghee and butter. During further investigation, we found out that the accused had been running the racket for the last five months," said DCP (Central Noida) Rambadan Singh. He further said, "They used to buy butter and ghee of different brands from Kondli in Delhi and then they used to repackage the same items with the Amul wrapper and sell in the market at Amul's rates. To street vendors, they sold the fake items for a cheaper rate." DCP Singh also said a total of 11 persons were involved in the group and five have been arrested so far. He said that six accused are absconding and will be arrested soon. The arrested accused have been identified as Sanjay Singh, Rajkumar Singh, Asif Ali, Sajid and Deepak Malhotra. A case under IPC sections 420 (cheating), 467 and 468 (both related to forgery), 272 and 273 (adulteration of food or drink intended for sale) was registered at Phase 3 police station.

The deceased has been identified as Suraj Kalbhor. Suraj had gone to his in-laws' house at Gahunje. Suraj had married Santosh Bodke's daughter one and a half month ago. On Sunday morning, he went to the fields for a walk. Three-four assailants gathered around him and assaulted with sickles. In a few seconds, Suraj lay in a pool of blood. Senior police officials rushed to the spot after they were informed. It is not yet clear why Suraj was killed. According to preliminary estimates, the murder may have happened with an intention to loot Kalbhor.

The police are probing the case. Suraj Kalbhor was residing behind Star Hospital in Akurdi. His mother works in a civic hospital and he was working in a polytechnic college, according to sources. She saw that her husband was alone in the field and took out a knife which she had brought with her. Within seconds, she slashed his neck and smashed his head with a huge stone. Suraj lay in a pool of blood and died later. Ankita had claimed that her husband had been attacked by assailants. A probe by the police revealed the facts and it became clear that Ankita had killed her husband.

ALMOST 80 SCHOOLGIRLS POISONED, HOSPITALISED IN NORTHERN AFGHANISTAN

In Afghanistan, girls are banned from education beyond sixth grade, including university, and women are barred from most jobs and public spaces. Nearly 80 girls were poisoned and hospitalised in two separate attacks at their primary schools in northern Afghanistan, a local education official said on June 4. It is thought to be the first time this kind of assault has happened since the Taliban swept to power in August 2021 and began their crackdown on the rights and freedoms of Afghan women and girls. Girls are banned from education beyond sixth grade, including university, and women are barred from most jobs and public spaces. The education official said the person who orchestrated the poisoning had a personal grudge but did not elaborate. The attacks took place in Sar-e-Pul province over Saturday and Sunday. Nearly 80 female students were poisoned in Sangcharak district, said Mohammad Rahmani, who heads the provincial education department. He said 60 students were poisoned in Naswan-e-Kabod Aab School and 17 others were poisoned in Naswan-e-



Faizabad School. Faizabad School. "Both primary schools are near to each other and were targeted one after the other," he told AP. "We shifted the students to the hospital and now they are all fine." The department's investigation is ongoing and initial inquiries show that someone with a grudge paid a third party to carry out the attacks, Rahmani said. He gave no information on how the girls were poisoned or the nature of their injuries. Rahmani did not give their ages but said they were in grades 1 to 6. Neighbouring Iran has been rocked by a wave of poisonings, mostly in girls' schools, dating back to last November. Thousands of students said they were sickened by noxious fumes in the incidents.

VIRAL TWEET ON ODISHA TRAIN ACCIDENT FALSELY LABELS TEMPLE AS MOSQUE

Several social media users believed in the claim and shared the image extensively. Many tagged PM Modi, PMO and other government Twitter handles requesting them to "demolish all mosques that were in close proximity to the railway lines." As anxious relatives scramble from one hospital to another to identify their loved ones who perished in the monstrous triple-train collision in Balasore district of Odisha leaving 275 dead and over 1000 injured, certain social media users tried to project it as a communal angle to the incident. An aerial view image of the accident began to gain momentum as certain social media users pointed out a white building located near the accident site, falsely labelling it as a mosque. A verified Twitter handle called The Random Indian posted an image showing the derailed coaches and an arrow directed towards a nearby white structure nearby accompanied with words, "Just Saying... Yesterday Was Friday". The tweet has now been deleted after fact checker and Alt News co-founder Mohammed Zubair called out the claim as false.

'KING KOHLI': BENGALURU POLICE TRACK DOWN CULPRITS WHO MURDERED 82-YEAR-OLD WOMAN

It is not everyday that former India captain Virat Kohli has a role to play in arresting a criminal on the run for a murder. It is not everyday that former India captain Virat Kohli has a role to play in arresting criminals on the run for a murder. But the 34-year-old batter recently had an indirect role to play in the arrest of murderers of an 82-year-old woman in Bengaluru. The words 'King Kohli' written on an autorickshaw helped city police track down the murderers of Kamala N Rao, whose body was found in the Mahalakshimpuram area of the city. Police officials said that the incident took place on May 27. Investigating officials identified three men- 34-year-old plumber Siddharaju C M, 40-year-old R Ashok and 33-year-old C Anjanamurthy- as the accused, all of whom were arrested on Friday. Senior police officer Shiva Prakash Devaraju told the media that the trio had plotted to kill the woman to try and repay around their debts. "Ashok visited Kamala's house for plumbing



works and noticed that she was living alone. Her husband had passed away last October. A few days ago, he revealed it to the other accused at a bar. Siddharaju then agreed to rob Kamala's gold ornaments to repay their debts," a police source told The Indian Express. The report stated on the 27th morning, the accused removed the number plate from Anjanamurthy's autorickshaw- which had the words 'King Kohli' written on them and moved around the woman's place. That evening they accused hired another rickshaw to the victim's house.

MUMBAI CRIME: TWO HELD FOR BRUTAL MURDER OF 27-YEAR-OLD WOMAN IN NAIGAON



Victim's husband chopped her head off but forgot she had two tattoos on her left hand, which helped cops identify her, and led to the arrest of the husband and his brother. Husbands forgetting crucial facts about their wives have led to many a marital argument but in this case, forgetting that his wife had a tattoo on her left hand led a Naigaon resident straight to prison. The Mira Bhayandar Vasai Virar (MBVV) police on Saturday arrested Mintu Singh and his brother Chunchun for the murder of Mintu's wife Anjali, after which they are alleged to have dismembered her body and disposed of the parts. According to the MBVV police, a suitcase containing the dead body of a woman washed ashore at the Uttan beach on Friday morning. It was spotted by a morning walker, who informed the police, and the cops opened it to find a headless body, hacked into two parts. While examining the body before sending it for post mortem examination, the police spotted an 'Aum' and a trident tattooed on the left hand of the deceased, which provided the first crucial clue. "We visited more than 40 tattoo artists in the Naigaon area, till we found the one who had tattooed both the symbols on the hand of the deceased. Using the artist's help, we were able to identify the deceased as Anjali Singh, 27, a resident of the Raj Emerald Society in Naigaon East," said an officer with the MBVV police. Anjali's husband, Mintu, was taken in for inquiries and after sustained questioning, allegedly broke down and confessed to having killed her. "Mintu, in his confession, has said that Anjali worked in the catering business and would frequently go out of station for 12 to 15 days at a time, which led him to suspect that she was cheating on him. This was the reason behind repeated arguments between the couple, and on May 24, they had a similar fight, during which Mintu smashed her head against the wall and then strangled her to death," the officer said. He added that Mintu subsequently called up his brother, Chunchun, and together, they procured a large knife and hacked the body, separating the head from the torso and further chopping the torso at the waist.

JAJPUR: 1 KILLED, 2 CRITICAL IN ROAD ACCIDENT

One person died and two others were critically injured as the bike they were traveling in collided with a Bolero in Odisha's Jajpur district. The accident occurred at Jodikua Chakk under the Jajpur police limits of the district. The deceased was identified as S K Moti, a resident of Medinipur. The injured were identified as Shaikh Nahaj Hussain and Ekra Moon. All three victims of the accident are said to be from West Bengal. According to sources, the bike they were traveling in had a head-on collision with a Bolero. Due to the accident, S K Moti died on the spot and Nahaj Hussain and Ekra Moon were critically injured. The injured were immediately rushed to Jajpur District Headquarters Hospital. Ekra Moon was later shifted to SCB Medical College and Hospital as his condition deteriorated. On being informed, police reached the spot, recovered the body, and sent it for autopsy. The cops also initiated a probe into the matter.

7 BRIDGES COLLAPSED IN BIHAR IN LAST 1 YR



Patna, June 5 (IANS) The Bihar government is facing criticism over the Bhalagpur bridge collapse but there are a long list of such incidents that happened in the past one year. On May 16, an under-construction road bridge in Bihar's Purnia district collapsed four hours after the concretisation. The locals alleged that the contractor and the engineers were using low quality materials which led to the mishap. On March 19, two persons were injured after a British-era road bridge collapsed in Bihar's Saran district. The injured persons were the driver and helper of the truck. The truck laden with stone chips went on the bridge. Due to excessive load of the vehicle, the bridge collapsed. The British-era bridge was built on Mahanadi river and its condition was in poor shape since the last floods. The bridge was deteriorating and cracks also appeared at several places. Despite all the deterioration, the road construction department has not declared it as a dangerous bridge. There was no warning sign board on either side of the bridge. On February 19, an under-construction bridge collapsed in Bihar's Patna district. The incident occurred at Bihta-Sarmera four-lane road. The road connecting Patna to Nalanda district is partially constructed. The incident occurred at Rustamganj village.
