

MANIPUR VIOLENCE: TEEN, POLICEMAN AMONG 4 KILLED IN FRESH FIRING INCIDENTS

Kangvai area in the Bishnupur district has long been a sensitive zone due to its proximity to both communities. To prevent the situation from worsening, security forces have established a 'Buffer Zone' and deployed personnel. Manipur: In the past 24 hours, at least four individuals, including a policeman and a teenage boy, have been shot dead in separate incidents in the border areas between Bishnupur and Churachandpur districts of Manipur. Additional casualties and injuries were reported, raising concerns about the escalating violence, killings and arson that have plagued these regions for the past two months. Sensitive Area and Buffer Zone Reports quoting Army sources reveal that the Kangvai area in the Bishnupur district has long been a sensitive zone due to its proximity to both communities. To prevent the situation from worsening, security forces have established a 'Buffer Zone' and deployed personnel. However, troublemakers from both sides



often manage to infiltrate through hillside and valley villages, engaging in gunfire exchanges. The recent clashes involved mobs from outside the area who disregarded the pleas of locals to disperse. Response by Security Forces A senior security official involved in the ground operations explained that mobs from both sides attempted to set houses on fire, but security forces responded in a coordinated manner and prevented the destruction. However, miscreants from both communities fired at each other from a distance, resulting in three fatalities and several injuries in Kangvai, Songdo, and Awang Lekhai villages. While the firing subsided during the early hours, mobs in the valley continued to hinder the reinforcement of security forces. Efforts to Restore Peace

Senior officers from the security forces have been tirelessly working to restore peace in the region by engaging with both communities. However, emotions remain high, and intermittent firing has continued, although the situation is reported as tense but under control. The Manipur police control room released a statement acknowledging the sporadic incidents of firing and the gathering of unruly mobs, which have triggered tension and chaos in some places over the past 24 hours. Government Action and Seizures In response to the escalating violence, a combined team of Manipur police and Central security forces demolished 18 illegal bunkers set up by miscreants and militants in various districts. Additionally, 50 illegal bunkers were razed within the past 24 hours. Furthermore, law enforcement agencies seized five sophisticated arms, 74 rounds of ammunition, and five highly explosive hand grenades in the Imphal East district.



65-year-old gets life sentence for sexually assaulting, killing man

MUMBAI: A 65-year-old man has been sentenced to life imprisonment for sexually assaulting and murdering a person in April 2018. Mumbai sessions court Judge A Subramaniam on Friday found accused Vijayan Thevar guilty under Indian Penal Code sections 302 (murder) and 377 (unnatural offences). As per the prosecution, Azad Maidan police received information about a man lying injured at a bus stop in the area. A police team found the victim bleeding with a head injury. He was rushed to a nearby hospital where doctors declared him dead on arrival. CCTV footage showed the accused hitting the man with a paver block and then sexually assaulting him.

ADANI COMPANY'S 6,000KG IRON BRIDGE 'STOLEN' FROM MUMBAI, 4 HELD

The cameras had captured a large vehicle moving in the direction of the bridge on June 11. The vehicle was tracked down on the basis of its registration number. It turned out that the vehicle was carrying gas-cutter machines which were used to dismantle the iron bridge and transport it, without informing Adani Electricity. Of the four persons arrested for theft of the bridge, one belongs to the firm that had been given a contract to construct the bridge, said the police. A spokesperson from Adani Electricity Mumbai Ltd. said, "Material stolen from the site has been recovered with prompt action of Mumbai Police. Investigations are ongoing."



Congress media in-charge booked for defacing public property

MUMBAI: The media in-charge of Mumbai Pradesh Yuvak Congress, Vijay Gore and some other party members have been booked for defacing public property after a poster critical of Bharatiya Janata Party was found on the wall of a public garden. HT Image The poster in question was propped up against the wall of General Arunkumar Vaidya Garden on Bandra Reclamation, according to Bandra police. According to the complaint, the 20X20 feet poster said, "Congress ka haath khuddar ke saath, BJP ka haath gaddar ke saath" (Congress is on the side of the self-respecting people, BJP is on the side of the corrupt). Along with the party symbols, the poster also featured a picture of Congress MLA Zeeshan Siddiqui and his colleague Vijay Gore, as per the complaint. "Our officers tried to ask if the party authorities had taken any permission for the huge poster. It then came to our notice that it was placed there without any official permission from relevant authorities. As the media in-charge of the unit of the party that was responsible for the poster, we booked Gore under the Maharashtra Prevention of Defacement of Property Act," said an official from Bandra police.

HEAVY RAIN CONTINUES TO POUND MUMBAI; YELLOW ALERT EXTENDED

Heavy rain continued to batter parts of Mumbai and Thane, where a yellow alert has been sounded by the India Meteorological Department (IMD), on Friday. Yellow alert indicates possibility of heavy to very heavy rainfall. The IMD has forecast another day of intense showers on Saturday as the yellow alert continues to be in place throughout Mumbai and Thane. According to IMD reports, between 8.30 am and 5.30 pm on Friday, the Santacruz observatory recorded 36.3 mm of rainfall whereas the coastal observatory in Colaba registered 2 mm of rains. Between Thursday and Friday until 8.30 am, the Santacruz observatory recorded 54 mm of downpour. Besides this, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation's (BMC) recording apparatus found that until 6.00 pm on Friday, the maximum rain recorded in the eastern suburbs was 33.02 mm. The western suburbs recorded 26.04 mm followed by the island city division which experienced 12.46 mm of rainfall. Following a day of incessant showers, the city woke up to spells of moderate rainfall on Friday. However, the intensity of showers picked up pace in the evening with the IMD issuing a nowcast warning at 4.45 pm, stating the possibility of moderate to intense spells of rain and gusty winds coupled with thunderstorm and lightning in isolated places of Mumbai and its neighbouring districts of Thane, Raigad, Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg.

Eleven killed in election-related violence during West Bengal panchayat polls. Videos of brutal violence going viral. TMC, BJP, CPI(M), Congress, and ISF among those killed. Eleven people lost their lives in election-related violence during the panchayat polls in West Bengal. The fatalities included six members of the Trinamool Congress (TMC) and one each from the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Communist Party of India (Marxist) (CPI(M)), Indian National Congress (Congress), and Indian Secular Front (ISF), while the political affiliation of another victim remains unknown. Violent clashes and the destruction of ballot boxes were reported in various parts of the state.

Fatalities and Violent Incidents

Among the victims was Madhab Biswas, a BJP polling agent allegedly killed in Coochbehar district. The BJP accused TMC supporters of preventing Biswas from entering the polling booth and escalating the situation to fatal consequences.

However, the TMC denied these allegations. In other incidents, a TMC worker was killed in



Murshidabad district, and a TMC booth committee member was reportedly attacked by the BJP in Tufanganj 2 panchayat samiti. Additionally, clashes between TMC and ISF supporters resulted in the deaths of an ISF worker and a TMC worker. Destruction of ballot boxes and instances of voter intimidation were also reported in various areas.

Videos are going viral of the brutal violence that is playing out in the eastern state as the panchayat polls are underway. In a video shared by journalist Sudhir Mishra, some workers can be seen open firing

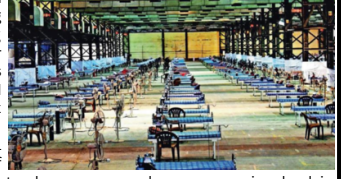
CONTRACTORS PAID RS 550 CRORE, ROUTED SOME TO AGENTS, BMC OFFICIALS AS KICKBACKS: ED

MUMBAI: MISSING COLLEGE STUDENT REUNITED WITH FAMILY AFTER RPF CONSTABLE RECOGNISES HIM



Mumbai's Azad Maidan police station reunited a 20-year-old student of Xavier's college in Dhobi Talao, with his parents after he went missing for almost 20 hours.

The boy, Shagnik Mukherjee, left college at 1 pm, but didn't reach home in Kalina, Santacruz. His father approached the police around 7 pm.

According to police, they scanned CCTV footage which showed the boy roaming around CSMT station for two hours within the premises (near the subway, ticket counter, platform and waiting room area). He took almost half a dozen trips within the city and later even hopped on a bus to Pune. Mukherjee, after roaming inside CSMT, took a train to Goregaon, and later sat on another train to Naigaon. Subsequently, he took a bus to Pune and then came back to Mumbai again via bus.

The police continuously watched harbour line footage till Wadala to track the boy.

Police had shared a photo with RPF (Railway Protection Force). The RPF constable at Dockyard station recognized Mukherjee.
