The victims, however, claimed they were attacked by the men who said they are not allowed to sell chicken. Sola police Inspector J B Agravat said that arrested men have been identified as Pratik Rajubhai Kanojiya (28), Mahavir alias Hukum Hansora (23) and Sonu alias Rokda Rajubhai Oza (25).

ZOMATO'S 'KACHRA' AD: THE CASTE-BLIND SOCIAL ILLITERACY OF CORPORATE INDIA

Technocratic, market-oriented education with a narrow focus results in people having little understanding of any kind of broad social-cultural issue. What else can explain the completely insensitive hashtag "#kachrabhikhelega" (waste/trash will also play)? Does the Zomato team behind this spot believe that this is inclusivity? The food delivery service Zomato released its latest promotional advertisement "Kachra can change the game"(Kachra in Hindi means waste/rubbish/trash). It is an attempt to showcase the work done by the company to mitigate climate change by recycling rubbish. The ad, however, is far more problematic than the usual ones made by corporations trying to greenwash their products. So much so that Zomato appears to have taken it down from social media platforms after a backlash.

The ad uses the character, Kachra, and references the hugely popular and iconic Bollywood film, Lagaan (2001). The film, set in 1893, during the British Raj, follows the inhabitants of a village in central India, who, burdened by high taxes and several years of drought, are challenged to play a cricket match by an arrogant British Indian Army officer as a wager to avoid paying the taxes they owe. The villagers face the arduous task of learning a game that is alien to them. The film was a resounding success when it was released. It played on the nationalistic sentiments of overcoming adversity. Underdog Indians won against impossible odds. Kachra in the film is depicted as having a disability, his right wrist and arm are withered from polio and he has an odd gait. He is also an "untouchable", a Dalit.

"CRIME AGAINST YOUTH": BJP, CONGRESS CLASH ON KARNATAKA TEXTBOOK REVISION

Earlier today, Karnataka Primary and Secondary Education Minister Madhu Bangarappa said that school books will be revised from this year itself.



New Delhi: Calling it a "bizarre censoring of Indian history," Union Minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar said the alleged removal of lessons on RSS founder Keshav Baliram Hedgewar from school textbooks in Karnataka would be a "crime against youth". Congress MLC BK Hari Prasad has claimed that the new Karnataka government will not approve the inclusion of chapters on Hedgewar, whom he also slammed as a "coward" and "fake freedom fighter". The BJP has hit out at the state government, demanding an apology, saying the Congress is distorting history. Earlier today, Karnataka Primary and Secondary Education Minister Madhu Bangarappa said that

school books will be revised from this year itself. Old books won't be recalled, but supplementary textbooks will be sent to school with instructions on what to teach and what to be left out, he said. Since the academic year started before he took charge, students already have the old textbooks, Mr Bangarappa said, and suggested supplementary reading to aid the transition. The revisions are being done in the interest of the children's future, he said, adding that the Congress already committed to it in their pre-election manifesto.



'Girls don't come to train anymore' — in Haryana hinterland, anger brews over treatment of wrestlers

Support for wrestlers demanding BJP MP Brij Bhushan's arrest is growing across rural Haryana, where akhadas are seen as a route to glory for young sportspersons. Chandigarh: For 45-year-old Dayanand Dhaka, kabaddi is more than just a sport. He started playing in his younger days, and years later, turned a plot attached to a crematorium in Haryana's Kirtan into a makeshift stadium with the help of fellow villagers.

His pet project was a hit. Over the past three years, more than a 100 boys and 25-30 girls have flocked to this 'stadium' each morning to play kabaddi, engage in a bout of wrestling, or train for sprints, marathons and other activities that don't need costly equipment. Last year, a girl and two boys from the village, located in Hisar district, were recruited by the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and the Army, respectively. They were regulars at the makeshift stadium.

It is not the same anymore. Ever since the allegations of sexual harassment against benchet Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) member Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh made the news, many have stopped sending their daughters for training, said Dhaka. "I personally went to some of the parents, requesting them not to deprive their daughters of this physical activity.
