THE MUMBAI Crime Branch on Sunday busted a gang that allegedly abducted a 27-year-old Andheri resident last month by posing as cops, and extorted Rs 5.3 lakhs from him on the pretext of "not booking him in a drigs case".

The Mumbai Crime Branch arrested the gang leader Deepak Jadhav (36) pm, four accused posing as narcotics officers on Sunday, after the victim filed a complaint. DCP (crime) Raj Tilak Roushan said they suspect the accused had duped several others in a similar manner. "We have arrested the mastermind and are on the lookout for five others who were involved in the abduction and extortion," Roushan said.

As per the complaint, the 27-year-old, who works at his father's stationery shop, was at a cafe in Versova on June 30, waiting with a friend to get a table. "Around 8 pm, four accused posing as narcotics officers approached him and said that a drug case was going to be registered against him. They said that if he didn't want the case to be registered, he would have to come with them. The 'cops' took him in an autorickshaw which was followed by another auto," the police said, adding that in all, there were six persons and the victim in two autos.

"The 'cops' asked him to pay up Rs 50 lakhs if he didnt want to get 'booked' in the case. Eventually, they took

Rs 5 lakhs from him through UPI and bank transfer. Since adding a beneficiary name to a bank account takes a few hours, the accused kept roaming around Mumbai for nearly six hours with the victim," Roushan said. They took his mobile handset, and eventually dropped him at his residence but came back to his home within a few hours, as per the statement. They scared his parents as well and took a cheque of Rs 7 lakhs from them, police said. By then, the family realised they had been conned and approached the crime branch.

A crime branch (unit IX) team led by incharge Daya Nayak tracked down Jadhav. During interrogation, the police found that Jadhav has a similar case registered against him at DN Nagar police station.

Police said Jadhav lived in Washim and comes to the city primarily to commit.

Hurdle To Ukraine NATO Membership Dropped As Leaders Gather For Summit

The breakthrough comes amid rare glimmers of disunity over Washington's controversial decision to supply cluster bombs to Kyiv.

Vilnius, Lithuania:

A key hurdle to Ukraine's membership of NATO was lifted Monday as leaders of the bloc gathered for a summit in Lithuania and Kyiv claimed it had made advances near Bakhmut.

A Western official told AFP that the allies "are set" to drop the Membership Action Plan required for Ukraine's application to join the alliance.

The breakthrough comes amid rare glimmers of disunity over Washington's controversial decision to supply cluster bombs to Kyiv.

Ukraine's foreign minister said the diplomatic move -- which Moscow said would have serious consequences for European security -- would shorten Kyiv's path to NATO membership, even though Ukraine must still undertake reforms before joining.

"NATO allies have reached consensus on removing MAP from Ukraine's path to membership," Ukraine's Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba wrote on Twitter.

It came as Kyiv said its troops captured key heights around the eastern city of Bakhmut.

Deputy Defence Minister Ganna Malyar said they had established fire control over the "entrances, exits and movement of the enemy around the city".

Its military had earlier claimed to have recaptured 14 square kilometres .

SENIOR CITIZEN LOSES LIFE DUE TO AMBULANCE MISHAP (CCTV VIDEO)

Pune : Pune Crime News | A heart-wrenching incident occurred at the toll booth in Dumarwadi, near the bus station at Otur in Junnar taluka of Pune district, where a senior citizen lost his life after being crushed by an ambulance driver while the vehicle was in reverse. The victim, identified as Razzak Mundhe, was admitted to the hospital after the accident but sadly passed away during treatment. The entire incident was captured on CCTV cameras in the area, shedding light on the unfortunate turn of events.

According to available information, the elderly passenger was standing at the bus station in Otur when an ambulance was exiting the parking lot. Regrettably, the driver accidentally crushed the passenger while backing up, unaware of the tragic accident. The ambulance staff immediately rushed the injured person to the hospital, but it was too late, and he succumbed to his injuries during treatment. The community is left in shock and grief following this devastating incident.

Questions have arisen about how the ambulance driver failed to notice the person standing on the road. It appears that due care was not taken while maneuvering the vehicle in reverse. The incident has sparked discussions in the area, as the loss of one life has raised concerns and demands for accountability. A complaint has been lodged with the police, and investigations are currently underway.

DELHI POLICE BUSTS GANG INVOLVED IN ATM THEFTS, 5 ARRESTED



Delhi crime: The police said they arrested five members of the gang and also recovered Rs 14.90 lakh from their possession.

Delhi crime: In a major success to the Delhi police, a gang was busted for being allegedly involved in stealing around Rs 15 lakh from an ATM at Sarai Rohilla police station area. The police said they arrested five members of the gang and also recovered Rs 14.90 lakh from their possession.

Speaking to the media, Deputy Commissioner of Police (north) Sagar Singh Kalsi said that the members of "Azad's gang" travelled in stolen SUVs with bogus number plates and only masked themselves while committing the crime, as opposed to the majority of ATM thieves who tamper with CCTV cameras, remove digital video recorders or displace the ATM machines.

The deceased were identified as Farman (27), a resident of Bulandshahar in Uttar Pradesh, Mohammad Dara (58) from Karawal Nagar, and Wasim (32) from Nand Nagri, and Imran (25) and Arman (20) from Usmanpur. They claimed to have also recovered 17 number plates of different vehicles, 15 screwdrivers, one toolbox, 10 pliers, one wire cutter and a hammer from the criminals.

PNB manager filed a complaint According to information, the police swung into action after Sarvesh Kumar Yadav, the second branch manager of Punjab National Bank, Shahjada Bagh Branch, Sarai Rohilla, filed a complaint. An inquiry was started after a case was filed in response to the complaint. The police squad examined the area and reviewed the CCTV footage from near the crime scene. The video footage made it clear that the suspect arrived in a grey car.

MULTI-CRORE GST SCAM: THREE MORE HELD, TOTAL ARRESTS 18

NOIDA: The Noida Police has arrested three more persons in connection with a multi-crore GST scam which has resulted in loss of revenue to the government.

The trio has been identified as Amit alias Monty (42), Ajay alias Mintu (41) and Mahesh (20). The total number of arrests in the case stands at 18, officials said.

The scam pertains to thousands of bogus companies being floated on the basis of forged Aadhar cards, fake invoices being raised by them and input tax credit (ITC) being claimed on their behalf, according to the police.

"The Sector 20 police station here is investigating the GST fraud. On Sunday, the police arrested three persons who were wanted in this case. They all were involved in fake invoicing," PTI quoted additional DCP (Noida) Shakti Mohan Avasthy as saying.

According to police, the trio is part of a larger syndicate whose 15 members have been arrested earlier.

These three accused lived in Sirsa, Haryana and worked for the last five years in the gang. Their work involved collecting and transferring money received from fake GST Bills.

MAHARASHTRA: FORGERY CASE AGAINST FORMER TEACHER OF THANE SCHOOL, EX-HEADMISTRESS AND CLERK

The Thane Police have registered a case against a former teacher of a private school in Maharashtra's Thane district, its ex-headmistress and a clerk for submission of alleged fabricated documents of the teacher, an official said on Tuesday, according to the PTI.

The teacher, now aged 58, joined the school located in Kalyan area in Thane as an associate teacher in 1994 and submitted the required certificates to the institution at that time, as per the PTI.

As some members of the school management had a doubt about the teacher's qualification, they asked for her service records which, till her retirement, were not provided by the headmistress and a clerk at the school, the official from Kolsewadi police station said.

Later, when the management verified the certificates submitted by the teacher at the time of joining the school, they were found to be fake and fabricated, he said. Following a complaint by the school management, a case was registered on Saturday against the former teacher, the ex-headmistress and the clerk under Indian Penal Code Sections 420 (cheating), 468 (forgery for purpose of cheating) 34 (criminal act done by several persons in furtherance of common intention), the police said.
