BHOPAL GAS TRAGEDY: IN SUPREME COURT, BIG SETBACK FOR CENTRE

FIRMS BE DIRECTED TO PAY ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION WORTH ₹ 7.844 CRORE

New Delhi: In a big setback for the centre, the Supreme Court today dismissed its petition seeking more compensation from Union Carbide for the 1984 Bhopal Gas Tragedy that killed over 3,000 people.

The centre had sought that the case be reopened and Union Carbide's successor firms are directed to pay additional compensation worth ₹ 7.844 crores to victims of the gas leak disaster. The government had argued that the enormity of the actual damage caused to human lives and the environment could not be assessed properly at the time of the settlement in 1989.



Rejecting the petition, the five-judge Constitution bench said the settlement can be set aside only on the ground of fraud and that the centre had not argued on this point.

The court also said that the centre had not provided any rationale for raking up this matter after two decades. It directed that a sum of ₹ 50 crores lying with the Reserve Bank of India be used to clear the pending compensation

JAIL OR BAIL? AIR INDIA FLYER TRIES TO 'LECTURE' JUDGE, WANTS ₹250 FINE OR...

The accused told the court he had read online that the fine payable under section 336 of the IPC is ₹250, which he was willing to pay, but not the bail amount.

A man booked for alleged unruly behaviour and smoking

on an Air India flight was sent to jail by a court here after he refused to pay ₹25,000 for bail and instead cited online 'search' to claim the fine payable under the IPC section was ₹250.

A court has granted the accused, Ratnakar Dwivedi, a cash bail, but he refused to pay the amount and told the court on Monday he was ready to go to jail. He was booked under section 336 (the act of endangering life or personal safety of others) of the Indian Penal Code after he was allegedly caught smoking in the lavatory of Air India's London-Mumbai flight and behaving in an unruly manner on March 10.



The accused told the court he had read online that the fine payable under section 336 of the IPC is ₹250, which he was willing to pay, but not the bail amount. Following this, the Andheri metropolitan magistrate sent him to jail on Monday.

Air India had said a passenger was found smoking in the lavatory of the flight and behaved in an unruly and aggressive manner, despite repeated warnings. According to Mumbai Police, the accused also caused a disturbance on the aircraft and endangered the lives of all passengers, besides disobeying the pilot's oral and written instructions to keep calm.

VIRAT KOHLI GIVES "BRUTALLY HONEST" ANSWER TO RAHUL DRAVID'S QUESTION ON CENTURY DROUGHT

It was after a gap of over 1200 days that Virat Kohli scored a century in the Test format.

After a gap of over 1200 days, Virat Kohli reached the tripledigit score in Tests, scoring 186 runs for India in the first innings of the Ahmedabad Test against Australia. The biggest chunk of the last three years wasn't the most pleasant in Kohli's career, with the batter struggling to score big runs in all three formats of the game. However, Kohli's will to bounce back paid off and in a matter of months he has multiple centuries in all three formats of the game. However, joining India's head coach Rahul Dravid for a chat after the conclusion of the Ahmedabad Test, Kohli was asked if the century drought in Tests was 'hard' for him. The batter gave a 'brutally honest' response.

In a video shared by BCCI.TV, Dravid asked Kohli if it was 'hard' for him to have not scored a Test century for such a long period.

In response, Virat said: "To be honest, I've led the complications to grow on me a little bit because of my own shortcomings. MUMBAI: FIRE WIPES OUT 1,000 HOUSES IN MALAD SLUM One body pulled out; blaze spread as fire brigade found it tough to

One body pulled out; blaze spread as fire brigade found it tough to navigate narrow approach road in densely populated Appa pada



A Fire engulfed nearly 1,000 houses at Anand Nagar slum in Appa pada, Malad East, and killed one person on Monday, officials said. Rescue operations were underway until late night. Firefighters struggled to reach the forestland, where the blaze erupted, due to narrow lanes.

The body was sent to HBT Trauma Care Centre and a search operation is underway to find any injured and missing people, said officials.

Witnesses told mid-day that slum dwellers heard multiple cylinder blasts late afternoon and ran out of their houses, which are located close to a forestland. The fire brigade contained the blaze by 7 pm and started cooling operations.

"The fire was confined to 800 to 1,000 huts over 10,000 square metres. Around 15 to 20 cylinder explosions had occurred," said a fire official.

Bapu Santish Borade, a resident of Sainath chawl committee, Ambedkar Nagar, Appa pada, said, "I was in my office when I got a call from my wife about the fire. Only my wife and son were at home and I told them to immediately leave the house and go to a safe place. My wife with the help of our neighbours removed the gas cylinder and vacated the area. All our belongings have been destroyed in the fire." STRUGGLE NAVIGATING

The fire was reported around 4.45 pm, but the fire brigade faced difficulty to reach the spot due to small lanes and the geography of the area. Officials declared it a level-three fire at 5.15 pm and more fire engines were rushed to the spot.

mid-day also saw the challenges the police and fire brigade faced while navigating the traffic, as the road off Western Express Highway, leading to Appa pada, is narrow. The highway became even more crowded in the evening.

A police constable, requesting anonymity, told mid-day, "The fire brigade and the police made every effort to prevent the fire from spreading to the forest, or else there would have been a huge loss to the forest cover in Sanjay Gandhi National Park (SGNP)."
