



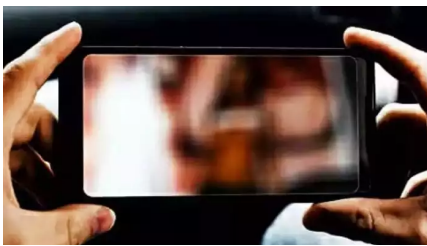

## MUMBAI CRIME: WILL SHOW A LINK TO A PORN SITE WITH YOUR PHOTOS, THEN...; A WOMAN'S COMPLAINT EXPOSED A BIG SCAM IN MUMBAI

**Mumbai Crime News:** While the incidents of crime are increasing in the state, cyber crime is also increasing in a big way. A shocking incident has come to light in Mumbai. Here, a driver sent women his morphed photos and created a sensation in the area.

**MUMBAI:** If you get a phone call saying your photos and videos have been uploaded to a porn site. Of course you will be scared. Taking advantage of this fear, the young man has done a shocking act. Mumbai Police has arrested a man who blackmailed women with similar threats, "Your photos and videos have been uploaded on porn sites, if you want to remove them, you will have to pay." Gambhir means that the accused is said to be a cab driver. You will be shocked to read but the accused is accused of blackmailing 24



women and extorting money. This driver used to hack women's social media accounts. He would steal his photos and morph them, and he would send the morphed photos to women and threaten to put them on porn websites. This is where his robbery started. According to a newspaper, the name of the accused is Ajay alias Vinod Kishanrao Munde and he lives in Gautam Nagar in Parbhani district. Santosh Dhanwate, police inspector of VP Road police station, said, "Munde used to message women through a link on Facebook. By clicking on that link, he would hack the women's social media

accounts. In this way, he hacked the accounts of many women." Ask less money so that women don't complain...

The police further said that after hacking the account, the accused used to send messages to the women. He used to tell them that his photos and videos were uploaded on porn websites. He would then send the morphed photos and videos to the women. Then ask for money to remove them from the porn website. For this he used to ask for a small sum of Rs 5000 to 10,000. He believed that women would not complain about him if he asked for less money. However, 3 women contacted the police and finally the accused was caught in the trap. The accused driver was arrested from Latur and he used to move to Latur, Nanded, Parbhani, Parli.

## MUMBAI: WOMAN SEXUALLY ASSAULTED ON LOCAL TRAIN: MAN HELD 8 HOURS AFTER THE CRIME

The woman was reportedly headed towards Belapur in Navi Mumbai which was empty at that time, the official said, according to when the incident took place, an official said.

A 20-year-old woman was allegedly sexually assaulted by a 40-year-old man in the ladies' compartment of a moving Mumbai local train when she was travelling alone on Wednesday morning. The accused was arrested after nearly 8 hours of the incident, a GRP official said, the PRI reported on Wednesday. The woman was reportedly headed towards Belapur in Navi Mumbai where she was supposed to appear for an exam, the news agency reported.

The woman boarded the Harbour Line local train at CSMT on Wednesday morning. As soon as the

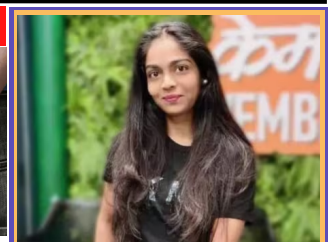
"He allegedly sexually assaulted the woman between CSMT and Masjid stations at around 7:26 am. He got down at Masjid station (next station after CSMT) when the woman raised an alarm and ran away," the official told the PTI.

The woman approached GRP and lodged a complaint, following which an FIR was registered against an unidentified person, the official said.

"Teams of personnel of GRP, Railway Protection Force (RPF), crime branch and Mumbai Police launched a manhunt for the accused. Police examined footages of CCTV cameras inside and outside the Masjid station. He was subsequently identified and nabbed at around 4 pm," the official said.

The accused is a labourer who works on daily wages. A case was registered against him under various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) including rape. Further investigation is underway, the official added.

Meanwhile, in another incident on Tuesday, a 24-year-old man was arrested by the crime branch of Mumbai Police for allegedly raping a woman under the pretext of marriage, an official said on Tuesday. The accused met the woman at a wedding in Uttar Pradesh and later became friends with her on Instagram.



## BENGALURU: AUTORICKSHAW DRIVER KILLS MAN, INJURES BROTHER OVER FARE DISPUTE

Bengaluru: An autorickshaw driver was arrested by police for killing a man and injuring his brother over increased fare dispute, police said on Tuesday.

The deceased, identified as Awod (28), and injured brother Ayub(26) had boarded autorickshaw from Chandapura go travel to Yesvantpur, where they had to board a train en route Odisha, police said.

Both the deceased and the injured brother worked as labourers in the city.

The accused autorickshaw driver, identified as SR Ashwath, had agreed on a fare of Rs 100.

"Once in the auto, the driver, midway, started demanding ₹1,500 per head, which is ₹3,000 in total... the brothers refused to pay the amount, which led to heated arguments between the three," said Hindustan Times, quoting the inspector of Subramanya Nagar.

The accused started punching the deceased on his face, abdomen and chest after the argument heated.

The patrolling police staff noticed Awod and further took him to a nearby hospital, where he was declared brought dead.

A case has been registered against the accused, under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code. Further investigation is underway, police said.

## GUJARAT: MAN BOOKED FOR RAPING MARRIED WOMAN IN PORBANDAR

A man from Gujarat's Porbandar district allegedly raped a married woman multiple times. The accused has been identified as Paras Goswami. The survivor filed the complaint against the accused on Sunday at Kalyanpur police station.

Porbandar: In an incident of sexual assault against women, a man from Gujarat's Porbandar district allegedly raped a married woman multiple times. The accused has been identified as Paras Goswami. The survivor filed the complaint against the accused on Sunday at Kalyanpur police station.

However, last week, when the woman had come in contact with Goswami almost a year ago, reported The Times of India. She met the accused at her elder sister's house. They exchanged phone numbers and soon they started chatting. As per the media report, the



woman went to her mother's house in Khambhalia. The accused raped her. He also allegedly recorded the videos of the heinous act. After that, the accused reportedly raped the woman multiple times by blackmailing her.

However, last week, when the woman rejected Goswami's demand to have a physical relationship, he beat her up. He even continued to stalk her on the phone. When things become worse, the woman narrated the entire ordeal to her family members. She then approached the police.

## 27-Yr-Old Hyderabad Student Stabbed to Death by Brazilian Man at Her London Residence; 3rd Suspect Arrested

The accused, Keven Antonio Lourenco De Moraes, has now been arrested from Harrow, near the crime scene of Neeld Crescent in Wembley.

London police made the third arrest in connection with the stabbing of a 27-year-old student from Hyderabad at her residence in Neeld Crescent, Wembley on Tuesday.

Kontham Tejaswini, who was pursuing higher education in London, was allegedly attacked by a Brazilian man in north London at around 10 pm on Tuesday.

The other accused had recently moved into the shared accommodation, where Tejaswini lived with her friends, less than a week ago, the victim's cousin Vijay claimed.

The Metropolitan Police had earlier released the image of Brazilian national Keven Antonio Lourenco De Moraes to seek the public's help in tracing the suspect. Keven, 23, has now been arrested from Harrow on suspicion of murder and taken into custody, the Met Police said.

Two other people, a 24-year-old man and a 23-year-old woman, were arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder. While the man remains in custody, the woman has been released without further action, the police said, according to news agency PTI. Tejaswini's family members in Brahmanapalle in Hayathnagar said they were informed about the attack on Wednesday and she died.

### MUMBAI: POLICE NAB HISTORY-SHEETER HOURS AFTER THEFT IN MALAD

The suspect, with several past cases registered against him, was arrested on Tuesday within hours after he allegedly committed theft at a catering firm in the western suburbs of Mumbai, the police said. Hours after a 29-year-old alleged history-sheeter decamped with cash from a catering firm in Mumbai, the police was able to locate and nab him, an official said on Tuesday, according to the PTI.

The suspect, with several past cases registered against him, was arrested on Tuesday within hours after he allegedly committed theft at a catering firm in the western suburbs of Mumbai, the police said, reported the PTI.

The police established the accused's identity based on the CCTV footage from the area and apprehended him in Malad and recovered the stolen cash, the official said.

The accused has 16 cases to his name, some of them registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) and Arms Acts, he said.

Meanwhile, in a separate case, the Malwani police also nabbed a Bangladeshi national for during the day for illegal stay. The man, who



was traced to Nallasopara area, was living in the country without valid documents, the official added.

Meanwhile in another incident on June 9, a 38-year-old man from Maharashtra's Raigad district was arrested for stealing silver idols from a temple apparently to clear a debt that he was struggling to repay, police had said on Friday, according to the PTI.

Mahesh Nandkumar Chaynakhwa was taken into custody on Thursday in connection with the theft at the Khandoba temple of Theronda village in Alibag taluka on May 18, police had said in a release.

Chaynakhwa, a local resident, had borrowed Rs 1.4 lakh from some individuals for his wedding and business but could not repay the money.

### ULWE YOUTH FINED RS 26,000 FOR ASSAULTING TICKET-CHECKER

MUMBAI: In a rare case, a sessions court has imposed a fine of Rs 21,000 on a passenger and asked him to pay another Rs 5,000 as compensation to a train ticket inspector (TTI) who was manhandled after the accused was asked to pay the penalty for travelling without a valid ticket.



On February 4, 2020, TTI Joseph Peterappa and his colleague Sunil Kurane asked a 25-year-old Ulwe resident travelling in a first class coach of a Panvel-CSMT train for his ticket. They said he could not produce a valid ticket and asked him to pay the fine.

The youth was deported at Seawoods station, where he showed a photo of a ticket booked on the UTSonmobile app. According to railway rules, a photo of the mobile ticket is considered invalid, and the checkers insisted on the fine. This angered the youth who manhandled both Peterappa, who lodged an FIR at Vashi station, in his order last month, additional sessions for judge, city civil court, Dr S D Tawshikar said the Railways Act is considered, accused needs to be accused was 25 then and did not have criminal antecedents. So as offence under section 147 of the Railways Act is considered, accused needs to be punished by a fine of Rs 1,00,000," said the ruling.

The judge also asked the accused to pay Rs 5,000 to Peterappa,

### MUMBAI: 'THEY SAID THEY WERE GOING TO PLAY CRICKET WHEN THEY LEFT HOME'



The young boys took a group photo and posted it on Instagram with a message—live every moment like it's your last. Then ventured into the rough sea, not knowing the present consequence. On the afternoon of Monday, eight friends, aged 12 to 16, told their parents that they were headed out to play cricket and left their home in Vakola. Once outside, they clicked a group photo that they posted on Instagram with a caption, "Jio to asa jio ka apna akre pal haa". It roughly translates to: live every moment like it's your last.

However, around 4.30 pm, they travelled much ahead and five of them ventured into the tidal waves off Juhu Koliwada. The rough sea waves, created by Cyclone Biparjoy, swept four boys into the sea, while one was saved by a local fisherman.

On Tuesday afternoon, the police recovered the bodies of all the four boys who had drowned the day before. They were identified as Jay Roshan Tachpariya, 15, Dharmesh Valji Bhojaiya, 16, and brothers Manish Yogesh Oganiya, 12, and Shubham Yogesh Oganiya, 15—all residents of Datta Mandir Road in Vakola, Santacruz East. The bodies were handed over to their parents after an autopsy. The Santacruz police have registered an accidental death report (ADR) in the matter.

One of the deceased boy's family told mid-day, "On Monday, all eight boys told their parents that they are going to play cricket in the rain. They each took Rs 10-Rs 20 from their parents and left."

### 23-YEAR-OLD MADHYA PRADESH MAN KILLED IN SUSPECTED HATE CRIME

THE FATHER AND MATERNAL UNCLE OF A WOMAN, WHO THE MAN WAS IN A RELATIONSHIP WITH, HIRED THREE SHOOTERS, WHO KILLED THE MAN



Bhopal/Gwalior: A 23-year-old man was killed allegedly by the family of a woman he was in relationship with in Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior district, a senior police officer said on Wednesday, adding prima facie it appeared to be a case of hate crime.

The father and maternal uncle of the woman, Kanishka Sharma (22), hired three shooters, who killed the man, identified as Yash Singh Rathore, a resident of Ghasmandi in Gwalior, on June 9, the officer said.

The woman's father, Bhushan Sharma, and three shooters — Abhishek Nadia, Sunny and Sagar Shukla — were arrested late on Tuesday night, Gwalior superintendent of police (SP) Rajesh Chandel said, adding that the woman's uncle, Pawan Tiwari, was absconding.

"The investigation so far has revealed that Bhushan Sharma was opposed to his daughter's relationship with Yash Rathore as they belong to different castes," the SP said.

Rathore belonged to an Other Backward Class (OBC) community, while the woman is a Brahmin.

"Sharma had tried to get his daughter married twice in the past, but on both occasions Yash showed his photos with the woman to the prospective groom families, who called off the wedding," the SP said.

"Sharma again fixed his daughter's wedding on June 22, but fearing the 23-year-old might again sabotage it, he hatched the plan to get him killed."

An investigating officer said that initially the accused planned to thrash Rathore and snatch his phone to delete the couple's photos. "They, however, changed the plan and decided to get him killed," the officer said.

Police said the shooters were paid ₹1 lakh to kill Rathore.

A case of murder was registered at the Kila Gate police station in Gwalior on June 11 based on a complaint filed by Rathore's father Ramvaran Rathore, officers said.

### MUMBAI: TANTRIK OFFERS TO GET RID OF HUSBAND'S GIRLFRIEND FOR RS 1.6 LAKH, HELD

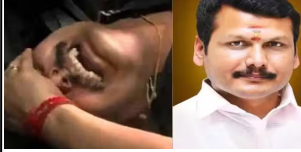
MUMBAI: A 34-year-old tantrik was arrested for taking Rs 10,000 from his client to make a woman suspected of having an illicit relationship with her husband disappear.

Accused Vikas Uniyal had demanded a total of Rs 1.6 lakh from Nasreen F (33), promising to make the woman in her husband's life disappear in 13 days with his 'black magic', said a Kherwadi police officer.

Uniyal was caught by the police patrolling team from Bandra (East) when Nasreen's husband Ibrahim (35), who runs a furniture business, approached them for help after he noticed his wife being given advice by the accused.

Ibrahim learned about the tantrik and his offer to make a woman disappear when he received a call from one of his friends, an auto-rickshaw driver, alerting him that his wife had hired his vehicle to meet a tantrik near a restaurant in Bandra East. "I got the matter confirmed after my friend recorded the conversation between my wife and the tantrik. I reached the spot and found my wife paying Rs10,000 to the man," said Ibrahim in his complaint to the police, adding that his wife had already spent around Rs 5 lakh on such occult practices.

IND vs AUS WTC Final: Pat Cummins-led Australia became the first team to win all four ICC trophies after beating India in the World Test Championship final on Sunday. Chasing 444 for the win, India were bundled out for 234. India required to score 280 runs on the fifth and final day of IND vs AUS WTC 2023 Final Test with seven wickets remaining but were bowled out even before the second session started. For Australia, Nathan Lyon and Scott Boland bagged the maximum four and three wickets, respectively. The last time India won an ICC trophy was under MS Dhoni's captaincy in 2013.

Shubman Gill's controversial dismissal on Day 4 of IND vs AUS WTC Final Test became one of the most talked about things in cricketing world. Australia's Cameron Green took a difficult catch in the slips off Shubman's bat. The on-field umpires then decided to send the decision upstairs for third umpire to take the final call, who then declared Shubman caught out. However, replays later showed that the ball had touched the ground when the fielder made impact.
