A NEWLY MARRIED WOMAN WAS KILLED BY HER IN-LAWS FOR DOWRY.

Mumbai Crime News: A shocking incident has come to light from Mumbai's Mira Road area. A newly married woman was killed by her in-laws for dowry. Even after arranging the marriage with great fanfare, Maher was tortured to bring money. Tired of constant demands, the Mahers refused to pay. The family of the deceased woman has alleged that the in-laws killed the married woman and faked her suicide. As this incident happened in a highly educated family, there has been a lot of excitement in the area. In this case, a case has been registered against the married woman's husband and in-laws at Kashmiri Police Station of Mira Road. As soon as the case was registered, the Kashmiri Police (Police) has dispatched 3 teams to search for the accused. Such an incident from a highly educated family has created a stir.

Asmita's husband Abhay is an engineer and told that he is working for a big builder and has a luxurious house in Juhu, Mumbai. However, after Asmita realized that she was actually cheated, she told her mother. Father again sent her money. But, that money did not satisfy them. He wanted Asmita's father's house. But seeing that I am not getting a house, Abhay says I am still old. I left her home saying I can still get married. When Asmita's father told us to bring the ornaments and all the things we wore in the wedding, Asmita's husband Abhay apologized to his in-laws.

MANISH SISODIA IN CBI CUSTODY. HOW HIS ARREST UNITED OPPOSITION LEADERS

MANISH SISODIA ARRESTED: THE CONGRESS ALLEGED THAT INSTITUTIONS LIKE THE ED, THE CBI AND THE INCOME TAX DEPARTMENT HAVE BECOME INSTRUMENTS OF "POLITICAL VENDETTA" UNDER THE NARENDRA MODI GOVERNMENT.

While in the past, Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal has claimed that the notion of "Opposition unity" to defeat the Bharatiya Janata Party "doesn't work", it seems the arrest of his deputy Manish Sisodia in the alleged liquor scam has brought together opposition parties on the common cause ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha election. Last year, Kejriwal had said political leaders will not make an alliance that can make India number one. "We must gather all 130 crore people of India to make this country number one," he said.

Without naming anyone or any particular case, the Congress on Monday alleged that institutions like the ED, the CBI and the Income Tax Department have become instruments of "political vendetta" under the Narendra Modi government and opposition leaders are selectively targeted to destroy their reputation.

The assertion came on a day a special court sent the Delhi deputy chief minister to five-day CBI remand after the agency sought his custody for effective interrogation to unravel the alleged scam in the now-scraped excise policy for 2021-22. Sisodia was arrested on Sunday after around eight hours of questioning by the CBI.

"The Congress has always held the belief that institutions like ED, CBI and Income Tax Department have become instruments of political vendetta and harassment under Modi Sarkar," Ramesh tweeted. "These institutions have lost all professionalism. Opposition leaders are selectively targeted to destroy their reputation," Ramesh

TERRORISTS WHO KILLED KASHMIRI PANDIT IN PULWAMA SHOT DEAD IN ENCOUNTER: J&K POLICE

The police identified one of the deceased persons as Aqib Mustaq Bhat, who initially worked for the Hizbul Mujahideen before moving to The Resistance Front.

The Jammu and Kashmir Police Tuesday shot dead two 'terrorists' at Padgampora village in Awantipora of Pulwama district, who were accused of killing a 42-year-old Kashmiri Pandit two days ago. The police identified one of the deceased persons as Aqib Mustaq Bhat, who initially worked for the Hizbul Mujahideen before moving to The Resistance Front.

The personnel also recovered incriminating materials including arms and ammunition from the possession of the second 'terrorist'.

The second 'terrorist' was neutralised a few hours after the police gunned down the first person. "One more terrorist killed (Total 02). Incriminating materials, including arms and ammunition, recovered. #Search going on. Further details shall follow (sic)," the Kashmir Zone Police tweeted.

Soon after the first person was gunned down, the J&K Additional Director General of Police, in a statement on Twitter, said: "Killed terrorist identified as Aqib Mustaq Bhat of Pulwama (A category). He initially worked for HM terror outfit, nowadays he had been working with TRF. Killer of late Sanjay Sharma neutralised."

Two security force personnel were also injured in the gunbattle which began after a cordon and search operation in Padgampora area, reported news agency PTI.

Two days ago, Sanjay Sharma, who worked as a bank guard in the Achan area of Pulwama, was shot less than a hundred metres away from his home while on the way to buy medicines from the local market with his wife. While his wife escaped unhurt, Sharma was critically injured in the attack and died as he was being rushed to hospital.

Sharma's is currently the lone Kashmiri Pandit family in the village. Sharma is the fifth Kashmiri Pandit to be killed in the Valley since militants renewed targeted attacks on the community in October 2021. He was among four of the five victims who had not left the Valley when militancy erupted in Kashmir.

An undated photo of Sadaqat Khan, an accused in the Prayagraj murder, with Samajwadi chief Akhilesh Yadav was shared by BJP leaders on Twitter.

Calling Samajwadi Party a "nursery of criminals", Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Brajesh Pathak said that the government has zero tolerance against crime.

"Our government has a zero tolerance against crime. The whole state knows that the Samajwadi Party is a nursery of criminals. But we are committed to ensure that no matter what reach any criminal has, we will not spare that person," Mr Pathak said.

Responding to the photo, Akhilesh Yadav said that anyone can come up and get a photo clicked with a public official.

"One can get a photo clicked with anyone. Yesterday, the CM and I had a photo together. Its the age of social media, anyone comes and gets photo clicked," he told the media.



JAPAN FOREIGN MINISTER LIKELY TO SKIP G20 MEET IN INDIA: REPORT

It remains unclear whether he will attend a Friday meeting of the Quad nations, consisting of the US and Australia, alongside India, according to the official, who asked not to be identified in line with policy.



Japanese Foreign Minister Yoshimasa Hayashi is unlikely to attend a meeting of G-20 foreign ministers in India from Wednesday, instead prioritizing parliamentary business, according to a government official.

It remains unclear whether he will attend a Friday meeting of the Quad nations, consisting of the US and Australia, alongside India, according to the official, who asked not to be identified in line with policy. The news was reported earlier by Japanese media, including the Nikkei newspaper. A deputy minister is likely to be dispatched in his place, the reports said.

Keeping the foreign minister at home for a domestic matter could irritate Group of 20 host India. The move comes as Japan seeks to bolster security and other ties with Narendra Modi's government amid growing concerns about China's assertive behavior in the region, as well as Russia's war in Ukraine.

INDIA'S ECONOMY SEEN LOSING SPEED AS RISING RATES HURT DEMAND

ECONOMISTS ARE PROJECTING GROWTH OF 6.9% FOR THE FISCAL YEAR FROM APRIL 2022 TO MARCH 2023 - A TAD BELOW THE GOVERNMENT'S PRIOR 7% ESTIMATE AND SLIGHTLY HIGHER THAN THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND'S 6.8% PROJECTION.

India's economic expansion likely slowed in the October-December period, as rising borrowing costs crimp consumption that's a key growth driver.

Gross domestic product probably rose 4.7% last quarter from a year ago, according to a median estimate of economists in a Bloomberg survey ahead of data due Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. local time. That will be the slowest quarterly performance since the 4.09% expansion in the three months ended March last year.

Economists are projecting growth of 6.9% for the fiscal year from April 2022 to March 2023 - a tad below the government's prior 7% estimate and slightly higher than the International Monetary Fund's 6.8% projection.

"There are signs that higher interest rates are feeding through to the real economy," said Shilan Shah, a senior economist at Capital Economics in Singapore, citing falling passenger vehicle sales and slowing retail transactions. "This suggests that consumption has weakened a touch."

Waning consumption, which accounts for 60% of GDP, risks hurting growth in Asia's third-largest economy, as borrowing costs rise. The Reserve Bank of India has increased interest rates by 250 basis points since May to tame inflation and signaled it isn't ready to pause just yet, amid growing dissent within the rate-setting panel.

"My fear is that all sources of demand in the economy are contracting at the same time," Jayanth Rama Varma, an external member of RBI's Monetary Policy Committee, said in a recent interview.
