KARNATAKA: BENGALURU POLICE ARRESTS ONE MORE IN TERROR SUSPECTS CASE

RT Nagar Police in Bengaluru have arrested another man linked to the terror suspects case being investigated by the crime branch on Monday, officials informed.

As per the officials, the arrested accused is said to have been in constant touch with a man named Junaid, who is said to be in a Middle Eastern country (on the run) and handling the others.

According to the police, a few weeks ago, 5 men were arrested for suspected terror activities, and guns and grenades were recovered from their possession.

Cops who were on the lookout for their associates have arrested a man identified as Arshad from RT Nagar in Bengaluru, they said.

Arshad is said to have tried to slit his own throat as cops tried to box him in. They have managed to get him to the hospital and save him, and he has been arrested, they added.

Further investigation into the matter is underway.

PUNJAB CRIME: STALKER SHOTS 15-YEAR-OLD GIRL DEAD IN AMRITSAR VILLAGE

Senior superintendent of police (rural) Satinder Singh said, "The accused, who is an adult, is absconding. Our teams are conducting raids to nab him." A 15-year-old girl was shot dead by her stalker in a village falling under the Ajnala sub-division here on Tuesday.

Senior superintendent of police (rural) Satinder Singh said the accused has been booked under Section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code and other relevant sections of the Arms Act.

According to the police, the incident took place around 5 pm when the girl was present at her aunt's (mother's sister) house in the village.

The accused belongs to the same village of the victim. Police said the accused had been harassing the girl for marrying him.

"The accused had been stalking my daughter for the past six months.



Fed up with his behaviour, we had sent the girl to her aunt's house in Ajnala. However, the accused didn't stop and continued harassing my daughter there too," said girl's mother.

She said, "On Tuesday, the accused reached my sister's house and started enquiring about my daughter. When my sister and her family members did not tell him anything, he barged into the house wielding a pistol. The moment he saw my daughter, he shot her. She was rushed to a private hospital where the doctors declared her dead."



China's new map row: Kapil Sibal recollects PM Modi's 'laal ankh' for Beijing, questions India's negotiation capacity

China including Arunachal Pradesh and Aksai Chin in their new official 'standard map' has amped up tension between Delhi and Beijing. Notably, a few days ago China's premier Xi Jinping and India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi had met on the side lines of BRICS summit and sought that the LAC stand-off be solved as soon as possible.

Senior advocate of Supreme Court and Rajya Sabha MP Kapil Sibal on Wednesday said that China asserting claim on Arunachal Pradesh is 'not a new thing'.

"We already know that the Aksai Chin has been under China for many years...That is not a new thing...China's claim on some portions of Arunachal Pradesh is also not a new thing..." Kapil Sibal said in an interview to news agency ANI.

Sibal also took a jibe at PM Modi and said, "When the Prime Minister was in opposition, he used to say that we should show 'laal ankh' to China...But now it appears that the talks take place by sitting in the same swing".

"External Affairs Minister (S Jaishankar) himself has said that China is bigger economic power than us..."

MANIPUR VIOLENCE: CBI TAKES OVER 27 FIRS, INCLUDING 19 RELATED TO CRIME AGAINST WOMEN

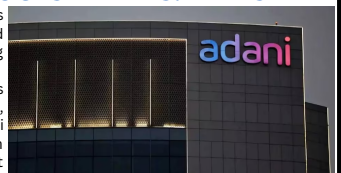
The CBI has taken over the investigation in 27 FIRs lodged in connection with ethnic clashes in Manipur that have claimed more than 160 lives in nearly four months, officials said. According to the latest data, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has so far registered 27 cases handed over to it by the state police -- 19 cases of crime against women, three related to an armoury loot by a mob, two of murder and one each of rioting and murder, kidnapping and general criminal conspiracy, sources aware of the developments said. The agency has re-registered these cases but has not made the details public because of the sensitive nature of the situation prevailing in the northeastern state, they said. CBI teams have started questioning the suspects and victims after visiting the crime sites, the sources added. The investigation gained momentum after the CBI top brass mobilised a team of 53 officers, including 29 women, drawn from various units of the federal agency across the country to probe the cases, they said. With the society in Manipur divided on ethnic



lines, the CBI is facing the critical task of avoiding allegations of bias during the operation as any involvement of people from one community will result in fingers pointed from the other side, the sources said. They said several of these cases being probed by the CBI may attract provisions of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, which can be probed by an officer of the rank of deputy superintendent of police. Since the deputy SPs cannot be supervisory officers in such cases.

'DON'T SHOOT ME': MAN WITH PLACARD AROUND NECK SURRENDERS BEFORE POLICE IN UP



Gonda (UP), Aug 30: A man wanted in a loot case surrendered before the police here with a placard hung around his neck that read "I have come to surrender, don't shoot me", officials said on Wednesday. The man, identified as Ankit Verma, has been on the run for the past six months, they added. "It is a result of the fear of the police among the criminals that they are surrendering," Circle Officer (CO) Navina Shukla said. On Tuesday, Verma reached the Chhappia police station with a placard hung around his neck and shouted, "I have come to surrender, don't shoot me," he said. The placard also carried the same message in his handwriting, the police officer said. One Amarjit Chauhan of Mahuli Khori village had filed a complaint with the police alleging that when he was returning from a college on February 20 on a motorcycle, two men stopped him near Piprahi bridge and looted his two-wheeler, mobile phone and wallet at gunpoint, he said. Subsequently, a case of robbery was lodged and during investigation, the names of Ankit Verma and another person came to the fore, Shukla said, adding Superintendent of Police Ankit Mittal also announced a reward of Rs 20,000 on their arrest. Station House Officer Suresh Kumar Verma said the man was placed under arrest and other legal formalities were carried out. The surrender of the man before the visit of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath here is being described by the police as a "big achievement".

'SEPTEMBER RAIN MAY MAKE UP FOR SHORTFALL OF 'DRIEST' AUGUST': OFFICIAL

Dr M Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, said the monsoon is expected to recover significantly after September 4. India is likely to see the driest August since 1901, when the country began keeping weather records, but the monsoon is expected to recover significantly after September 4, a senior official has said. Speaking to NDTV, Dr M Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, said rainfall in August has been far below normal and the intensifying El Nino conditions played a big role in that. El Nino is a weather phenomenon that occurs when ocean temperatures in the central and eastern Pacific Ocean rise above normal. This causes changes in atmospheric patterns, leading to a weakening of the monsoon circulation over the subcontinent. The monsoon tends to be weaker and less reliable during El Nino years. Mr Ravichandran also attributed the below-normal rainfall this month to the Madden-Julian Oscillation (MJO) which is known to reduce convection in the Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea. "In May itself, we had forecast normal rainfall in June and July.

SAHABHAGITA: COMMISSIONERATE POLICE'S NEW INITIATIVE FOR CRIME PREVENTION, DETECTION IN BHUBANESWAR

'LIKE TASTING COOKED VEGGIE': SCIENTIST ON CHANDRAYAN CONFIRMING SULPHUR, OXYGEN ON MOON

Chandrayaan 3 confirms oxygen: Remote sensing is done from about 100km away but Chandrayaan 3s findings are straight from the ground, a scientist said. Chandrayaan 3 on Tuesday confirmed the presence of sulphur and oxygen on the moon apart from many other elements like aluminium, calcium etc. Explaining the significance of the finding, scientist TV Venkateswaran told news agency ANI that it is like tasting cooked vegetables to confirm whether they are fully cooked. "We can see and tell if the vegetables are cooked from a distance. But we won't accept that. We will take a piece and taste it to see if it is properly cooked. In the same way, you need to land on the moon at least in a few places, look for this data and see whether this data matches the remote sensing data. If they match then our confidence in the remote sensing data will be very high," Venkateswaran said. Chandrayaan 3 has confirmed the presence of sulphur, oxygen among several other elements on the moon. Explaining the significance of the finding of the Chandrayaan 3 vis-a-vis remote sensing data which previous missions procured, Venkateswaran said, "This provides the ground routine.
